## 2006 Wing Staff Conference

This year's Wing Staff Conference will be held on Feb.18-19, 2006, at the MCM Grande Hotel Fun Dome (formerly Holiday Inn Hotel and Suites) in Odessa, Texas.

A block of rooms has been reserved at a special price of \$62 per night for CAF members. To receive this special rate, attendees should identify themselves as being with the Commemorative Air Force (CAF) Wing Staff Conference when calling for reservations. All reservations should be made by Feb. 1, 2005, to receive this special rate. After Feb. 1, reservations will be accepted on a space and rate available basis. For reservations, call the MCM Grande Hotel Fun Dome toll free at (866) 362-2311.

Registration fee for the conference is \$45, which includes the Friday night dinner and Saturday lunch. On Friday evening, Feb. 17, 2006, the social hour will begin at 6 p.m. with dinner following. The conference will begin at 8 a.m. Saturday morning and will end Sunday before noon.

Unit awards will be presented at Wing Staff Conference.

### SNB Progress Report

During the months of November and December the SNB work parties in Guymon, OK, were able to clean the exterior and the wheelwells. The fuel tanks were removed, cleaned, and made ready to seal. The engine oil was drained from both engines. The number 1 engine was disconnected and made ready for removal to replace the motor mounts. Col Downing ran all the compression checks and preliminary inspections. During the next trip {in an ice storm} all of the oil lines in the wheelwells were removed. I was told that this is the hardest job we will have to do and it was certainly a learning experience. I have never been so oily and dirty in my life. I was so oily that I could not get wet taking a shower. After three showers and three rings in the tub I was able to get clean. Needless to say the wheelwells will need some more attention. The floorboards were removed for another inspection and cleaning. All oil lines were replaced and the fuel system is next. Col Downing also believes he can replace the broken frame rib without removing the tail section. If so, this will save a lot of time and money. The SNB project is progressing well and on schedule. Hopefully, there will be no surprises to delay us.

#### **Cactus celebrates Veterans' Day**

Graham's annual Veterans' Day celebration had a special calling for the squadron. Cactus Colonel Greg Melton, Pioneer Elementary School principal, began the annual tribute to veterans, using a school cafeteria, eight years ago, but the public's response was so enthusiastic that the event was moved to Graham Municipal Auditorium. It was there that Cactus Squadron members brought memorabilia from their Robert E. Richeson Memorial Museum, located above the Cactus Squadron hangar at Graham Municipal Airport. The items included uniforms and personal mementos from a number of Graham veterans, and were displayed for attendees in an anteroom of the auditorium.
